The Incarnation

At the center of Christmas is Jesus, both fully God and fully man. "In Bethlehem, humility and glory in their extremes were joined," wrote pastor R.G. Lee (1886-1978). When Jesus came to earth, Lee explained, he descended:

- from the heights of glory to the depths of shame,
- from the wonders of heaven to the wickedness of earth,
- from exaltation to humiliation,
- from the throne to the tree,
- from dignity to debasement,
- from worship to wrath,
- from the halls of heaven to the nails of earth.
- from the coronation to the curse,
- from the glory place to the gory place!

"Born in a stable! Cradled in a cattle trough! Wrapped in swaddling clothes of poverty!" Lee wrote. "No room for him

who made all rooms! [No] place for him who made and knows all places! Oh, deep humiliation of the Creator — born of the creature, woman! But in his descent was the dawn of mercy.

Because we cannot ascend to him, he descends to us."

Christian symbol



ADVENT COLORS — One of the season's symbolic colors is blue, representing hope. During Advent, we wait in hope to celebrate again God's coming in human form. We also look forward in hope to Christ's coming in glory at the end of the age. Purple symbolizes the royalty of Jesus, the coming Prince of Peace, and the penitence with which we receive him. Some congregations also use pink or white candles in Advent wreaths, with pink symbolizing joy and white symbolizing the Christ Child.

To prepare for their discussion of <u>The Little Liar</u> by Mitch Albom, Mayflower's Book Club has arranged a private 90-minute docent-led tour of The Holocaust Museum (975 Imperial Golf Course Blvd. Suite #108) on Monday, January 13 at 10:00 am. Everyone in the congregation is invited to join the Book Club on the tour, which will be conducted during non-public hours. The cost is \$15, and the group size is limited to 25. <u>The Little Liar</u> by Mitch Albom tells the fictional story of four characters who experience the Holocaust from different perspectives. Their lives are forever changed by the deception and violence of one man and by a lie told by an innocent Jewish boy who had never before told a lie. The novel addresses the damaging effects of lies, the complexity of human relationships, and the widespread devastation of the Holocaust.

Mayflower's Book Club will discuss <u>The Little Liar</u> at their monthly meeting on Tuesday, February 4 at 7:00 pm. Everyone in the congregation is encouraged to attend and participate in this meaningful discussion.

A Mission Moment at the Guadalupe Center:

A ride through Immokalee was how our field trip started. The very enthusiastic guides, Elizabeth Cuevas and Emily Osterhaus picked us up at Mayflower church in their Guadalupe Center van for a very special tour.

Elizabeth and Emily visited our Mayflower church service on 9/29 and provided a wonderful presentation about the Guadalupe Center for our congregation. This is how our tour evolved in order for Mayflower members to see the

Center and deliver the books collected from our book drive for the children of the Guadalupe Center. If anyone is interested in attending a future tour please sign up on the list in the narthex and we will make the arrangements.

Several of our members loaded the van with "4 crates of books" that we collected for the children at the Guadalupe Center, all donated by our wonderful congregation.

It was a rainy trip all the way to Immokalee, but the conversation was filled with the bright beginnings of the Guadalupe Centers humble start in 1984 at a soup kitchen with homework help by a Sister from Our Lady of the

Guadalupe Church. Today the Center is reaching more than 1,901 students per year!

We learned so much about the families of Immokalee and their vast farming community. Immokalee means "My Home" and the pride we felt from both Emily and Elizabeth about these roots was so heart warming and inspiring.

From the colorful artistic murals greeting us as we entered the town to the migrant housing for many of their families, this was a very eye opening tour that helped us understand the many challenges these families face day to day.

Many of the small homes are crowded, hosting many more people than they are intended to, so not enough beds or blankets and quilts to go around. We learned how transient the farming jobs are and how some families might

travel far to other states to find work in seasonal crop fields in order to feed their family. Farming duties and picking crops is not always sensitive to the school schedules, just another huge challenge for the school and the children. The van pulled into the Guadalupe Center, Van Otterloo Campus and we continued our tour into a beautiful facility where the children were attending their childcare program and preschool programs in state of the art classrooms.

We watched several classes enjoying their nutritious lunch and others preparing for library time. We learned more about the after-school tutoring programs for the first and second graders. This is accomplished by high school students being paired with the elementary students, a win-win arrangement fostering so many talents and sharpening their leadership skills.

The theme of helping each other grow, planting the seeds of generosity and compassion then watching the children thrive into young adults and come back full circle to 'my home' and give thanks to their beginnings was such an inspirational message. "For the children of Immokalee, education is their way out of poverty, and Guadalupe Center is their vehicle".

If we could each bring an unwrapped gift by Dec 6th from the list to church, all will be collected in the Narthex and picked up by the Guadalupe Center.
