A young woman was deeply troubled by the suffering she saw in the world, as well as by struggles within her own family and friendships. Unsure of how to help or where to begin, she turned to her pastor for guidance. He responded with a heartfelt letter. A portion of it read: asks what he should say if the
Egyptians questions who sent him to

states, "I AM WHO I AM." Centuries
later, when people wonder who Jesus is,
his answers hint at his divinity: "I AM the
light of the world; I AM the good
shepherd; I AM the bread of life" and,
perhaps most profoundly, "Before
Abraham was, I AM" (John 8:58). On
Pentecost, God's Holy Spirit comes
upon the apostles as fire. Thus the
burning bush is a powerful symbol of
God's presence echoed through time.

"Life is difficult. It is sometimes like a mindless boot camp. We seem to be rehearsing for something that is beyond our present knowing. We come from a beginning that we cannot remember, and we move toward a destiny that we cannot see. Only imagination, faith and a friend here or there give us the strength to go on.

When Jesus said that we would always have trouble in this world, he added an encouraging word that we should never forget: 'Take courage; I have overcome the world.'

I cannot fix you. You cannot fix you. Do not put your ultimate faith in me, or in

yourself, or in any human being. Trust the Lord of the Harvest. He will fix you when he comes."



More than Reading, 'Riting and 'Rithmetic

You may recall that many followers of Jesus called him "Rabbi." In essence, the word means teacher. Clearly the word describes the brilliant Nazarene who was constantly teaching his listeners about God and God's expectations of humans.

In a secular society, it is of paramount importance that the teachings of Christ be proclaimed and affirmed wherever

possible. In the early days of our country, it was customary for public schools to teach reading, writing and arithmetic as well as Christian principles. Subjects being taught were presented in a setting of morality, religion and character development.

The reading book compiled by William H. McGuffey in 1836 focused on such themes as self-denial, temperance, obedience, and warned against laziness, profanity, stealing and vanity.

In our time, however, when it is difficult to focus on God and spiritual matters in public schools, our churches and families have a great responsibility. Sunday school attendance, not only for children but for adults as well, must be of primary importance. Prayer, as well as discussion of social issues from a Christian point of view, must be practiced in the home and church. We must learn and teach about Christ.

"Learn from me," Jesus said. "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:29 NRSV). Where shall we learn of him or from him if not in our churches and homes?

Our newest apartment building—the second to be constructed, is dedicated to providing transitional housing, painted in purple to honor the courage, resilience, and strength of survivors. 
